## Fourth Quarter Water Bill

The water bill included with this newsletter is your 4th quarter water bill and covers water used in October, November and December 2014.

As discussed in the Fall newsletter, the quarterly domestic water had a small rate increase. Water rate increases take place in October, in accordance with the District's fiscal year.

Quarterly domestic water rate, assuming no excess water use, will be \$57.00; this equals \$19.00 per month or \$0.63 cents per day.

All quarterly invoices will reflect all activity that occurred during the quarter.

## Odd/Even Watering Schedule

It has become necessary for Hayden Lake Irrigation District to start an Odd/Even Outdoor Watering Schedule.

Last year the District was unable to keep up with the demand for water during the peak sprinkler times from 3 AM to 9 AM.

The District will send out a letter to all customers in March to communicate the new watering schedule as well as an article in our next quarterly newsletter and on our website.

The Odd/Even Watering Schedule will be as follows:

Street addresses ending with an odd number may water on Monday, Wednesday and Friday.

Street address ending with an even number may water on Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday.

New lawns; sod, seed or hydro-seed may be watered daily until established.

While most of us enjoy having a lush, green landscape during the height of our outdoor activities, the large number of us watering at the same time causes stress to the water distribution system. Alternating our outdoor water days helps conserve valuable water resources and assists the District in meeting peak summer demands.

The odd/even schedule will allow customers to maintain landscaping to the level to which they are accustomed, while reducing temporary peak seasonal demands on the water distribution system.

We thank you in advance for your understanding and cooperation with the new schedule.

If we don't have the contact information the only option may be to turn off your water. Please use the back of the payment coupon to provide us with a telephone number where we can reach you.
